

This Hallowed Ground Slavery in New York

This map is a companion to a step-by-step audio walking tour and National Park Service Ranger-guided tour about New York City's early Africans, their struggle for survival in a new world and their resilience in fashioning an existence that belied their varied origins and bondage. The tour visits seven sites ending at the African Burial Ground memorial, part of a 17th and 18th century cemetery where approximately 15,000 African men, women and children were buried.
